PROGRAM OVERVIEW

CLCD's Global Health Internship Program provides students with real-life. hands on experience in research practice and intervention development to benefit mothers and children in a low-income country. The program has four main components: 1) Participation in a research project or community service project, 2) mentoring from leading researchers and service providers. 3) Training to enhance professional development, and 4) Facilitating student engagement in Ghanaian culture through visits to heritage sites.

Internship Programs

Some of the programs include volunteering in a health facility i.e. Maternal and Child Health Facility, Physical Therapy, Pharmacy and providing support for children living with developmental delays.
